Feedback Obtained

Feedback from all the stake holder except employers is collected. Students feedback: In the year 2018-19 606 students are admitted in the college out of which 10 percent i.e. 60 samples are collected according to 60 percent students' course is good. In present condition, as per 50 percent of students, course of study is better to stay in educational competition. However, 70 percent of students believe that, Syllabus helps them living in a social world. In the opinion of 50 percent students, change in current syllabus is needed. Infrastructure: As believed by 75 percent of students, they are proud to be students of college. According to 25 percent of students, given education is helpful for their future. Teacher Quality: Students feedback is taken about the teaching quality of the faculty. 88 students feedback is recorded and it is found that 27.28 percent faculty members teaching is good, 72.72 percent faculty are very good. Teachers Feedback on Syllabus: As stated by Teachers, Syllabus is satisfactory but also suggested some amount of changes in same. Alumni Feedback: 30 samples are collected from the Alumni. Around 40 percent of Alumni believe that, they should be allowed to be part of activities. To raise the education standard, college should allow us to be part of, stated 40 percent of Alumni. According to 50 percent of students, professors should help them with competitive examinations. Canteen should be pleasant as well as there should be clean water supply in college. The Alumni should be allowed to seat in library. Parents Feedback: 60 samples are collcted and noted their feedback as below: 80 percent parents stated that they are in a position to provide education to their ward. 55 percent parents stated that college is away from our village to attend regularly and 70 percent parents mentioned that no public transport facility is available.75 percent parents are worried about the security of girl child. 95 percent parents mentioned that their ward help them in farming purposes. 20 percent parents told that their ward is engaged in business. 100 percent parents believes that education imparted in the college is needful. 20 percent parents believes that education is hard and 80 percent believes that it is easy.
