Feedback Obtained

Students Feedback on syllabus: In the academic year 2019-20 614 students were admitted in the college out of which 10 percent samples i.e. 60 samples are collected and analyzed out of which 80 percent students noted that subject curriculum is good. 75 percent students pointed that syllabus is easy to understand. 70 percent students noted that syllabus is relevant and useful. 65 percent students observed that Syllabus is competitive one. Students' feedback on Teacher Quality : Feedback from 132 students is collected. 54.55 percent students noted that teaching quality is very good and 45.55 percent students observed teaching quality as good. Principal in the meeting asked the faculty members to be excellent in the next academic year. Teachers Feedback on Syllabus: Feedback on syllabus is collected from the eight faculty members. Economics dept. noted that syllabus of B.A. I IIIrd year is changed and is good for overall development. Dept. of Sociology observed that syllabus is good but not relevant to the current social conditions. Dept. of Commerce: 80 syllabus is good but options to choose the subject is to be provided to the students of B.Com IIIrd year. Dept. of Marathi: Language proficiency should be increased. Dept. of Hindi: Syllabus is useful for the students but provide opportunity for employment. Dept. of English: Syllabus is good and useful to develop skills. Dept. of Political Science: Syllabus needs to be changed as per the period. Dept. of Sports: syllabus is good but skill development should be considered. Five faculty members are working as the Board of Study Members of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad mentioned in 2.4.2. Employers: 12 samples are taken and all of them noted positive remarks about infrastructure, work culture, syllabus, quality of education, development and extension activities, cleanliness and research. Alumni: 40 samples are collected from the Alumni regarding the feedback about the Institute. All the students noted that they are feeling proud about the college. 80 percent students are happy with the development of the college. 50 percent students are happy to participate in college programs. 50 percent students are happy and 30 percent students are satisfied to participate in college development activities. All the students remarked that faculty members are helpful to extend helping hand in the counselling and guidance. Parents Feedback : 40 samples are collected from the parents of the Institute out of which 50 percent parents noted that they are economically sound to take education. 86 percent students have to travel more than 10 kms to reach the college. 84 percent parents noted that their ward helps them in farming. 60 percent parents remarked that their ward is doing business hence unable to attend the college on regular basis. 60 percent parents are satisfied about the quality of education. All the collected feedbacks are discussed in the meeting with the faculty and Principal in the meeting encourages and inspires faculty to undertake activities.

As ours is the full day college i.e. 10.30 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. faculty members are not much interested to spare extra time for the Bal Sanskar Kendra. Hence it is included in the college timing i.e. from 4.30 to 5.00 p.m. then the faculty members joined the Kendra. Initially the classes are taken under the tree. Afterwards the social hall of the community is made available by the People of the area for the Kendra. 4. The Practice: Lahuji Salve Bal Sanskar Kendra is a very unique activity of the college for the students from the backward area. The parents of the children from the area are not much interested to send their child because of ignorance towards education. Considering this fact college has started a Bal Sanskar Kendra in Phulmbri where the weekly market/ bazar is arranged. The students of age group of 4 to 10 years are given admission in the Kendra. A teacher is appointed by the college. Our secretary Dr. Sarjerao Thombre has given a donation of Rs. 35000/- for the Kendra and it is his brainchild to start a Kendra. From the annual interest received on the donation the remuneration to the teacher of Kendra is provided. Every faculty goes to teach to the Sanskar Kendra. Tuesday is holiday for the Kendra due to local market. A time table is available in the college regarding the duties on Sanskar Kendra. Along with the teaching schedule various programs like Raksha Bandhan, Makarsankranti, Diwali celebrations, 15th Aug. Independence Day Celebrations, Mahatma Gandhi Birth Anniversary, a gathering is also arranged in the Kendra. So that along with the children their parents also participate in above mentioned activities which is very helpful to inspire and motivate them and bring them in the mainstream of education to remove the ignorance of darkness. 5.
